## Not Your Typical Ethics Training

This is not a training where we'll review all of the ethics rules that you already know. After all, you already signed off on a code of ethical conduct as a part of gaining a professional credential or as mandated by your employer. You have a lot of obligations in this regard. Obligations for which you can be held accountable.

Instead, join us for this six-hour ethics training that moves well beyond a focus on boundary issues and addresses issues related to sex and sexuality, countertransference, use of social media, culture/race/ethnicity, issues of power and control, professional identity and other topics that have the potential to get in the way of effective and meaningful therapeutic relationships with the potential for harm to the client and professional suicide for the counselor.

After all, Ethics, as that branch of philosophy that attempts to discern "right" behavior, is most often dependent upon the exploration of context as a deciding factor in any ethical analysis. If I can accept a gift from a friend or neighbor, what's the harm in accepting a small gift from a client? Is there a circumstance in which it might be acceptable to accept a gift from a client? If so, what's the difference? We'll spend considerable time looking at these contextual nuances with many issues common to clinical practice that might apply in the specific environment of behavioral health and the part you might play in promoting a practice based upon integrity.

**Presenter Bio:** *With more than 30 years of providing direct service as a clinician, clinical supervisor and program executive director, Tom Baier currently provides consultation in the areas of substance abuse treatment and medication assisted treatment as well as psychiatric rehabilitation as well as providing training and education to direct service personnel. He serves as adjunct faculty for the Villanova University Certificate Program in Alcohol and Drug Counseling where he was the Program Coordinator for 10 years as well as teaching in the Drexel University College of Nursing & Health Professions in the behavioral health tract. Mr. Baier is a three-term past president of the board of directors for the Pennsylvania Certification Board (PCB) where he also serves as the chairman for the education committee and sits on the ethics and finance committees as well. Tom is the 1991 recipient of the Lorraine Hinkle Memorial Award for outstanding contributions to the field of drug and alcohol treatment awarded by Villanova University and holds a Master's degree in Human Services (MHS), is a Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC), and holds PA State Certificates as an Alcohol and Drug Counselor (CADC), and a Certified Clinical Supervisor (CCS). In addition to having served as a substance abuse counselor, clinical supervisor and human services program administrator, Mr. Baier remains actively involved in several workforce development initiatives designed to promote careers in treating substance use disorders. As a program surveyor for the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF), Tom is involved in the promotion of substance use disorders treatment best practice standards on the national level. His current focus is the implementation of evidence-based practices in medication assisted treatment for opiate abuse.*
